The 1998 Peace Prize Festival is an afternoon-long celebration of peace expressed in music, dance, art and theater by students from school, church and other youth groups with a majority of participants from peace-site schools. The students' commitment to peace is also celebrated by other distinguished guests at the Festival, including Nobel Peace Prize laureates and the Norwegian Nobel Committee.

The Festival offers an array of artistic exhibits, skits, music and storytelling about the ideals of peace — created by student participants from the Festival's Adopt-A-Laureate Program. This program, coordinated by World Citizen, Inc., promotes commitment to peace by encouraging students to study the complex dynamics in which the laureates intervened to promote peace. At the Festival, students demonstrate their enlarged understanding of peace, and dialogue about what they learned with dignitaries and Festival participants.

The Peace Prize Festival is held each year, in cooperation with the Peace Prize Forum and the Norwegian Nobel Institute, for youth and others in the general public to come together in expression of their personal commitment to peace.

Peace Prize Forum



The tenth annual Peace Prize Forum is to be held on February 13-14, 1998, at Concordia College (Moorhead). The Forum will focus on the theme: "Striving for Peace: Visions of Authentic Development." Established in 1989, the Peace Prize Forum examines the complex dynamics of conflict and the challenges of peacemaking.

The Forum is organized in cooperation with the Norwegian Nobel Institute in Oslo and hosted on a rotating basis by five colleges of Norwegian heritage: Augsburg, Minneapolis, MN; Augustana, Sioux Falls, SD; Concordia, Moorhead, MN; Luther, Decorah, Iowa; St. Olaf, Northfield, MN. The two-day event offers opportunities for dialogue among Nobel Peace Prize Laureates, diplomats, scholars, students and the general public.

The program for the Forum will include:

- Pre-Forum event for schoolchildren from the Fargo-Moorhead area.
- Opening address by José Ramos-Horta, 1996 Nobel Peace Prize Laureate.
- Plenary sessions with invited Nobel Peace Prize Laureates, human rights activists and other dignitaries.
- Concurrent workshops exploring topics related to the Forum's theme.
- Dramatic presentation of "The Caucasian Chalk Circle" by Bertolt Brecht.
